Changes to Student Accounts

Kia ora kōrua,


Over the holiday break Onehunga High School is going to have several of the core computer systems and services upgraded.

As such there are some important changes you need to be aware of which will affect how you use your school account and devices moving forward.

These changes will take affect on the second week of the school holidays (week of the 22nd of April)

Logging into Google Services

Student login accounts to the Google Services will be changing from username@onelearn.nz to username@student.ohs.school.nz



Please note that this will be the same google account, it will just be accessed via a different username.

The account will use the same password.

Logging into a School Computer

The process of logging into a school computer will remain the same.

The same login name you use currently which is in the format aa#### (e.g. as1234) will still be using when accessing a school computer.





Logging into Office 365 Services

Student login accounts to the Microsoft 365 Services (Office) will change from username@ohs.school.nz to username@student.ohs.school.nz



Please note that this will be the same 365 account, it will just be accessed via a different username.

The account will use the same password.

General Information

- Data that is currently in Shared Google Drives will remain the same.
- Data that is currently in Personal Google Drives will remain the same.
- Data that is currently in Personal Microsoft One Drives will also now include a new folder which will contain your data from N drive.
- Your computers My Documents which currently redirects to N Drive, will redirect to the same data when you login to a computer.
