

Year 13 Business students attended the introductory session of the Young Enterprise Scheme, at the University of Auckland Business School recently. The programme is designed to propel students into entrepreneurship and give them the confidence to be problem solvers and perhaps future business leaders. Over a thousand students working in groups, will start their own business, having developed a product and brought it to market. They will learn essential skills along the way, including: problem solving; creative communication; leadership; decision making; time management and networking.
