At Level 1, the 86% pass rate in 2025 is a significant increase from 74.6% in 2024 and continues the strong upward trajectory from 59.5% in 2022. This result meets the school's aspirational 85% target and sits well above the national average, reflecting exceptional improvement in foundational student achievement.

At Level 2, the 77.3% pass rate in 2025 continues the strong progress made in recent years, rising from 60.1% in 2022. The school now performs above the national average, demonstrating the impact of consistent academic monitoring, targeted support, and a strong focus on learner success.

At Level 3, the 83.9% pass rate in 2025 builds on the excellent 81.8% result in 2024 and represents a remarkable improvement from 57.4% in 2022. As the most demanding level of NCEA, this outstanding result highlights the growing academic capability of Onehunga High School students and the school's continued commitment to academic excellence.



Success for Students

We are extremely proud of the academic progress our students continue to make. Groups that have historically experienced lower levels of achievement are now demonstrating significant and sustained improvement.

Pasifika achievement at NCEA Level 2 has increased markedly over time, rising from 50.0% in 2022 to 80.6% in 2025. This substantial improvement reflects the success of targeted support, strong mentoring, and a sustained focus on ensuring Pasifika learners achieve their academic potential.

Māori achievement at Level 2 has also shown strong progress, increasing from 58.7% in 2022 to 78.6% in 2025, with particularly strong results recorded in recent years across all levels. This continued improvement highlights the impact of culturally responsive support, strengthened partnerships with whānau, and a commitment to ensuring Māori learners experience success as Māori.

These gains are especially significant given the growing number of Māori and Pasifika students remaining at school through to Year 13 and therefore being included in the achievement data. The increasing retention alongside rising achievement demonstrates the school's success in supporting more students to stay engaged in learning and achieve meaningful academic outcomes.
